With Jesus in His Way of Healing | Colossians 1:15-20

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S U M M A R Y

We've begun a series called 'New Creation'. Over the next 7 weeks we'll be basing our teaching and learning in Colossians 1:15-20 as our main scripture that reveals who Jesus is and how he is restoring fullness of life for everyone.

This past weekend we looked at the story of Job as an introduction and way of understanding Colossians 1:19-20.

R E A D

Colossians 1:15-20; Job 1:1; 1:9-11; 42:5; 42:12-15

Pause. Take time to prayerfully consider what has been read.

D I S C U S S

- 1) What does it mean in Colossians 1:20 that through Jesus, God has reconciled everything to Himself? What was it that was separated that needed to be brought back together?

Our experience in life doesn't always match the image of Col. 1:20. We often feel disintegrated and our suffering can make us wonder what God is doing. We are told that reconciliation (healing) has happened but we can feel stuck between the promise and the resolution.
