S U M M A R Y

This past weekend we looked at what kind of Father God really is and why we can come confidently to Him in prayer.

R E A D

Luke 11:1-13, Mark 2:1-12

Pause. Take time to prayerfully consider what has been read.

D I S C U S S

The prayer and teaching of Jesus begins with 'Our Father' and concludes by showing us what kind of Father our God is.

- 1) Why is having a true understanding of the Father heart of God so important in prayer and as followers of Jesus?
- 2) What truth does Jesus reveal about the character the Father is verses 11:13?

We looked at Mark 2:1-12 as a way of diving deeper into what God our Father is like as revealed in the person of Jesus Christ.

- 3) What are the implications and significance for our lives that the Father is revealed as:
 - Forgiving
 - Merciful
 - Powerful

- 4) Trusting that God our Father is like Jesus reveals, what kind of confidence do you have in asking Him for the gift of the Holy Spirit?

R E S P O N D

Reflect on the true nature of the Father as revealed in Jesus.

Ask God to heal any false image we have of Him.

P R A Y

Ask our good Father for the gift of the Holy Spirit.
