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S U M M A R Y

This past weekend we continued our exploration of New Creation by answering the question, "What makes new creation possible for us?".

R E A D

Colossians 1:15, Exodus 20:4, John 1:14, Philippians 2:5-11
Pause. Take time to prayerfully consider what has been read.

D I S C U S S

1. Why is a theology of New Creation so important for followers of Jesus? Why is it, or why isn't it, important to you?

The main questions on Sunday were, "How does new creation happen after the devastation of broken creation? How can a relationship between God, self, others and creation be restored? What hope do we have that new creation is a reality and that it can be our experience?" We proposed two answers. The incarnation of Jesus and the descension of Jesus.

2. What is your understanding of Christ's incarnation and how does it inform your experience of new creation?
3. What is your understanding of Christ's descension and how does it inform your experience of new creation?

R E S P O N D

Take time to study and meditate on the mystery and wonder of the Incarnation.

Reflect on the implications of the truth that Christ descended in order to initiate new creation for us.

Spend some time sharing and praying assurances of mercy over one another as Spirit leads you.

P R A Y

Ask Jesus for an experience of new creation that awakens us to the reality of true life that he offers us.
