S U M M A R Y

This past Sunday we continued our exploration of Jesus' message in the Synagogue in Nazareth. We discussed how in Jesus' proclamation of his kingship the blind recover their sight. We explored how blindness is both physical and spiritual.

R E A D

Luke 4:14-30 | Luke 11:33-36 | Luke 6:37-42

Pause. Take time to prayerfully consider what has been read.

D I S C U S S

- 1) What is sticking out to you from the passages?
- 2) When you hear the phrase recovery of sight to the blind do you think primarily about physical or spiritual blindness?
- 3) Do you have any experience with divine physical healing? Would you share the story?
- 4) What comes to mind when you think of spiritual blindness? What would signs be of it?
- 5) Luke 11:33-36 talks about how an unhealthy, or stingy, eye causes you to be in darkness, how can a stingy mindset affect the way you see the world? How can a generous mindset affect the way you see the world?
- 6) How have you seen Jesus healing your spiritual blindness?

- 7) What ways can you partner with the Spirit to bringing sight to the blind around you? How can you help him make Christ known to those around you?

R E S P O N D

Take time to sit in silence and ask the Spirit to reveal to you where your blind spots are that he's wanting to heal. If anything comes up confess this to him and ask him for his healing.

*Share how the Spirit is inviting you to respond today and the week to come – to **be with** Jesus, to **become like** Jesus, or to **do what** Jesus does.*

P R A Y

Ask Jesus to open your eyes to see him at work in you and around you.

Take time to wait and pray together. What is Jesus praying for? Come into agreement with His prayers.
